Had the more equitable income distributions of the three decades following World War II (1945 through 1974) merely held steady, the aggregate annual income of Americans earning below the 90th percentile would have been \$2.5 trillion higher in the year 2018 alone. That is enough to more than double median income

It's enough to pay every single working American in the bottom 90% an additional \$1,144 a month. Every month. Every single year.

This is the single thread that, once unraveled, can lead to the most amount of positive change in our country.

Another issue I feel strongly about is enacting universal health care.

According to The Hill, 22 different studies have shown that Medicare for All would save all of us money and offer comprehensive health coverage.

Allowing people to remain healthy and not have to stress over medical bills would go a long way towards a well balanced society.

In conclusion, I would like to see a revival of the American Dream that includes all of us. A rising tide lifts all ships. When we all feel seen and heard, then there is hope for the future.
